December Weaving Sample by Bev Weaver

This is a sample that I wove while studying parallel threading for the Foothills Study Group in 2010. Susan Wilson had just presented her mini-workshop to PPWG members on multi-shaft crackle, and I was determined to try to use what I had learned combined with a parallel threading.

The sample is woven with an 8-shaft crackle threading. The warp alternates between royal blue and black. The blue threads make up one crackle treading and the black ones are threaded for a block which is offset from the blue by 5 shafts. Each crackle block is repeated twice before going on to the next block. The treadling is one that was discussed by Susan Wilson during the multishaft crackle workshop.

The warp is 10/2 Cotton at 32 e.p.i with 4 per dent in an 8-dent reed and with black and royal blue alternating. The weft is a dark green yarn purchased at a 'stash sale'. It is approximately the same size as a 3/2 cotton yarn.

I used some of this fabric woven with dark red 3/2 weft yarns to make the bag which was entered in the Northern Lights challenge last May.
