February 2, 2008 Board Meeting

Sandy Hutton reported that the coverlet interpretations were being tracked on a spread sheet and the information is needed so that the Pioneers Museum can have the appropriate display methods available.

The issue of newsletter samples was discussed and a motion was made by Jan Seltman to have a scanned image for the newsletter with two notebooks available in the library, one for checkout and one not, of samples of a reasonable size. Karen Currier seconded the motion, there was some more discussion and the vote by the membership was unanimous to adopt this new method. The Standing Rules will need to be changed.

Linda asked for a member to coordinate a PPWG table at Colorado Weavers Day and Doreen McLaughlin volunteered. There is a potential networking opportunity the night before Colorado Weavers Day with the guild assigning a few members as delegates to the networking event.
